I, Ingrid Raye OSTBYE state;

- I am a former employee of the Department of Families [herein referred to as the department].
- 2. I commenced employment with the department around late 1989 or early 1990 at the John Oxley Youth Centre [herein referred to as JOYC]. I undertook the position of 'youth worker' on a causal basis for a period of 3-4 months, terminating my employment with the department in early 1990. My position of youth worker at JOYC was a second job for me as at the time I was a full time enrolled nurse at the Mater Children's Hospital. I had undertaken the casual position of youth worker at JOYC as a means to supplement my income as I was planning an overseas holiday. As a youth worker my role was to perform supervision of the child detainees whilst they undertook their daily duties such as meals and activities. Being a casual employee meant I would only be called in when required. This from memory ended up being about 3-4 times per month over my 3-4 month period of employment.

- 3. I do not recall who the manger or the names of any of the staff members I worked with at JOYC other than 'Darren'. I remember Darren as he later left JOYC and worked at Wolston Park before becoming a psychiatric nurse.
- 4. The only management issues I recall being aware of during my time at JOYC related to staff being unhappy with rostering. This was of a minor nature and not a big issue. I personally did not notice any other issues nor was I involved in any disputes or concerns whilst employed at JOYC.
- 5. I am not aware that an Inquiry was conducted at JOYC in 1989/1990. I attribute this to the fact that I was employed on a causal basis only. Further, after ending my employment at JOYC in early 1990 I travelled overseas for 12 months, not returning to Australia until early 1991. The term Heiner Inquiry does not have any meaning to me.
- 6. I do not know of any persons who may have given evidence as part of that inquiry.
- At no time was I ever approached or asked to provide any statement, either orally
 or in written form, to any Inquiry, person or body about my period of employment
 at JOYC.
- 8. During my period of employment at JOYC I was not a member of a union affiliated with the centre. I remained a member of the nurses union.
- 9. At no time was I aware, or have I since become aware, of any allegations or instances of sexual abuses relating to the JOYC or youth detention centres in Queensland. Had I known of any incidents during the time of employ I would have personally made report of such issues as I would have been aware of mandatory reporting of such matters due to my nursing background.
