I, Jacqueline Von Lossberg state;

- I am 47 years of age. 1.
- 2. I am a casual nursing assistant.
- I am a former employee of the Department of Family Services, [herein referred to as the 3. department].
- I first gained employment with the department in 1989 as a casual youth worker at the 4. John Oxley Youth Centre, [herein referred to as JOYC]. On average my working week consisted of about 3 to 4 shifts commencing at various times. At this time I was studying psychology at university. I ceased working for the department sometime in 1991.
- When I commenced work at JOYC, Peter Coyne was the centre's manager. Some of the 5. other staff I remember are as follows; Trevor Cox - middle management, Fred Feigeyouth worker in a senior capacity, a female youth worker with the first name of Lorraine, Peter McNeven - youth worker, Warren Christensen - youth worker, a female youth worker called Connie, a male youth worker called Dennis, June West - youth worker, Eileen Bisby – youth worker, Lyn Draper – management, a female youth worker with the first name of Jan, Scotty Healing - youth worker, Olly Isaacs - youth worker, a male youth worker with the first name of Ken, a female by the name of Wendy, Gloria

McNeven – kitchen, Mark Mills – youth worker, a male youth worker with the first name Rodney, Gary Truloff – youth worker, a male youth worker with the first name Barney, Narend Nath – youth worker, Ken Gerke – youth worker, Darren Leahy – youth worker, David Gold – Youth worker.

- 6. I left JOYC because of the stress of the job and the way the centre was being operated. I felt the centre could be run a lot better. I remember I was concerned about the residents learning more. I believed the kids had too short of a schooling day compared to children outside of JOYC. Basically the schooling was not consistent with kids not in detention.
- 7. I remember about the time that the manager Peter Coyne left JOYC. I remember I had heard from other staff at JOYC that Peter Coyne was in trouble. I can't recall which staff told me this information about Peter Coyne. I don't even know what the issue was even about. Personally I had no issue with Peter Coyne as I had little dealings with him.
- I don't know anything about an Inquiry conducted into JOYC. I do not recall the term Heiner Inquiry.
- 9. I have not appeared before or given an evidence to any Inquiry about my time at JOYC. I have not previously provided anything in writing to any inquiry or investigation in relation to my employment at JOYC. The first time I have provided any information about my time at JOYC was when I met with detectives Mison and Parer of the Child Protection Inquiry on the 13th November 2012.
- I have never reported to any person either within the department or external to the department about any instances of sexual abuse of detainees at JOYC.
- 11. As a youth worker I had on occasion heard rumour or talk of instances of sexual activity. I heard about two children who had sex with each other at JOYC. I did not witness this incident I was only told about it
- 12. I also recall that a co worker from Blaxland wing at JOYC a ended up getting together with a former resident of Blaxland wing a relationship was inappropriate. I remember hearing stories from other staff at the centre that was seeing outside the centre on weekend leave before she officially left JOYC for good. I didn't see this for myself. Once again I just heard about it.
